The **Singapore International Dispute Resolution Academy (SIDRA)** is pleased to present a webinar on the China International Commercial Court (CICC).

In 2018, China launched the rules that introduced the CICC. The CICC provides a one-stop dispute-resolution platform that co-opts the functions of the Chinese courts in litigation, mediation and arbitration. Its having improved the professionalism of its judges and mediators, and its having facilitated an international commercial arbitration and mediation mechanism, are two indicators of China's unwavering support for the BRI: The CICC supplies the missing piece in the implementation of the BRI. This presentation will demystify the CICC by analysing its legal design, its latest developments, and its practical operations.

**Dr. Jiang Huiqin**, A/Prof at Zhejiang Sci-Tech University and visiting faculty at SMU School of Law, will present an update on the latest developments and jurisprudence in relation to the CICC.

**Dinesh Dhillon**, Co-Head of Allen & Gledhill's International Arbitration Practice, will provide a comparative angle to the discussion by sharing his recent experience as counsel in *Kiri Industries Ltd v Senda International Capital Limited and another* [2020] SGHC(I) 27 before the Singapore International Commercial Court (SICC).

**Huiqin Jiang** is an Associate Professor at the School of Law and Politics, Zhejiang Sci-Tech University, and visiting faculty at Singapore Management University (SMU) School of Law. She completed the Bachelor of Laws and the Master of Laws at China University of Political Science and Law (CUPL).
